What is the ELCA Youth Gathering?

The ELCA Youth Gathering meets triennially. It is an opportunity for High School youth of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, the denomination that St. Luke's is a member of) to gather as one voice and one body. It brings together youth, and their adults, from across the country to one central location to experience Christ together.

The Gathering consists of four program areas: Interactive Learning, Synod Day, Service Learning and Mass Gathering. Congregational groups will be assigned to a rotation schedule to experience Interactive Learning, Synod Day and Service Learning.

Interactive Learning is a space for participants to

engage and be immersed in the life and breath of the church, the community of God. Through a variety of mediums, participants will engage in learning opportunities that support the mission of the Gathering and its theme, and that lift up partner organizations or groups, all in the Minneapolis Convention Center.



Who can attend?

Any 8th –12th grader in the 2021-2022 school year.

Do you have to be a member of St. Luke's?

No. You are welcome to invite friends who would like to attend the gathering and all the components of preparing for the experience with St. Luke's.

Are adults needed on this trip?

Of course! Adults, especially drivers over 21, are crucial to this experience. Adults interested in attending the Gathering as an adult particpant are invited to talk with Pastor Sally.

How are adult chaperones determined?

Just like youth have a variety of gifts and needs, so do adults. The primary focus of this trip as an adult participant is safety, support, relationship building with our youth and FUN! The gathering is unique as it includes lots of large group time. So if you don't enjoy very large groups, or get impatient in long lines, this trip might not be the best one for you.

boundless our God really is. In the past, Synod Day was held in hotel ballrooms; however, for this cycle we are excited to be hosted by local congregations. Participants will be transported with their synods to their host congregation for this program day.

Service Learning is an opportunity to take part in the Twin Cities' great story and live out our Lutheran faith by being God's hands and feet in the community. Participants will be able to work alongside our neighbors in the Twin Cities and share meaningful conversations with them. Participants will be transported to their Service Learning site that morning.



Mass Gathering is a time for all our Gathering



participants to gather and experience church at U.S. Bank Stadium. This provides a unique experience for participants to come together to sing, dance, pray, learn and ponder their faith. This time is filled with great music from the Gathering band, worship elements, a concert from a current Christian artist, and speakers from all walks of life.

On Thursday morning everyone will come together for worship, blessings and safe travels as well as an opportunity to share communion with 30,000 other people. Mass Gathering is livestreamed for everyone to see whether there are there in person or not.

How will we get there?

We will be driving to Minneapolis in 15-passenger vans. This allows us the flexibility to have our own transportation throughout the Gathering. It increases our restaurant choices, allows for breaks to cool down at the hotel, ability to run and grab things and to travel at our own pace.



How will we get around once we are there?

Depending on the location of the hotel we have choices. We can walk, use our vans, use the Gathering transportation busses or utilize the Minneapolis Light Rail system.

Where will we stay?

During the registration process, we will select housing choices. We will later be assigned a hotel. Often, synods are assigned to the same hotel. Typically, there are 4 youth to a standard hotel room. Roommates will be assigned during the registration process. Adults will only room with other adults unless they are assigned a room with members of their own family.

What will be eat?

Everyone has different eating patterns. What we are committed to is having a group breakfast so we know everyone has something in them to start the day, and a group dinner each night. Money will be given to students to be used toward lunch each day as they are hungry or thirsty. Students are encouraged to bring additional money as well.



Who is paying for the food?

As a part of participant fees and fundraising, we will pay for breakfast and dinner. Participants will be given \$15 daily to be used toward lunch/snacks.

Can we bring our own snacks?

Of course! However, they may or may not be allowed into U.S. Bank Stadium as the stadium food will be available for purchase.
